The Careers Education Advice and Guidance (GEIAG) Programme at WG6

The CEIAG programme at WG6 is integrated within the curriculum and form time and is designed to provide help at specific decision times to support you onto the next stage of your life, be it university, apprenticeships, training or employment. Careers education and guidance aims to develop your skills, talents, understanding and aspirations, enabling you to become a responsible citizen who achieves personal success. Through the programme by the end of Key stage 5 you will:

- Have the opportunity to reflect on your personal qualities and skills and how these relate to your future career aims
- Develop independent research skills
- Have opportunities to explore your post-18 pathway through computer-based information and independent and impartial on-line portal Unifrog
- Visit a HE (Higher Education) event and have attended a university or college open day, taster day or summer school
- Understand the UCAS process and be able to research different universities and courses using on-line resources
- Have been given guidance and support to help write a personal statement for university or apprenticeships
- Research different universities, courses and apprenticeship and training routes
- Have information and support with financial planning for university, work and training
- Have access to information about the world of work, trends and changes in the labour market to help identify opportunities and possible jobs of the future e.g. through on-line research, careers talks and presentations
- Receive impartial careers advice and guidance
- Have the opportunity to explore career areas through work experience and volunteering

How we deliver the CEIAG programme in KS5 - your entitlement

The range of activities that we provide includes

- Having the opportunity to attend careers talks during the school year from visiting speakers on a variety of topics related to the world of work and careers open to you
- Links to careers and employability skills in lessons including the relevance of STEM subjects for a wide range of career paths
- The PSHE programme in the areas of life skills, building self-esteem, and developing ethical decision-making skills
- Enrichment and enterprise activities to develop your employability skills (e.g. communication, teamwork, confidence) which will help you learn about the world of work and skills needed for employment
- Encounters with employers and employees and first-hand experience through work experience and volunteering in year 12
- A Careers Convention providing opportunities to talk to employers, colleges, training providers and universities
- Every student at WG6 has a registered Unifrog account which they regularly update in form time sessions to help you monitor, record and track your own employability

You can expect impartial guidance and support through

- Access to a personal guidance meeting offering impartial information, advice and guidance from the in-school Careers Adviser (by appointment or drop-in service available during lunchtimes, after school and parents evenings)
- Time to discuss your progress and career plans with your parent/carer and a member of the school staff
